Particularities of patent protection in Antigua and Barbuda

Up until 22 November, 2018 the Registrar's Office was accepting but not processing applications for registration. As of 22 November, 2018, date in which the new Patent Act 2018 entered into force, applications are processed on the filing of a request for examination, which must be done within six months from the publication date. If examination is not requested within the prescribed term, the application is deemed to be abandoned.

The patent term is 20 years from the filing date of the application, while utility certificates expire ten years after the filing date.

Absolute novelty is required, however a 12-month grace period is allowed for disclosure by the inventor or applicant, or in case of an abuse committed by a third party.
