Jurisdiction - General Information

Botswana has been a Contracting Party to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property since April 15, 1998. It has also been a Contracting Party to the Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) since October 30, 2003.

Botswana is also a member of the African Regional Intellectual Property Organization (ARIPO).

Online Patent Register and Online Gazette

Botswana has an **Online Register and** an **Online Gazette.**

The Online Register has been made with the platform WIPO Publish, allowing a selection through a slider button between a search limited to the most frequently used fields and a broader one enlarged to a wide number of search fields, some of which however could be left empty.

It can be searched by **Applicant** and **Inventor Name**, and provides a basic **Legal Status** information.

The Online Gazette is published monthly in English. For further enquiries, please contact the relevant authority as indicated in the <u>WIPO Directory</u>.

Features and search functionalities

ARIPO provides an <u>online information platform</u> for searching ARIPO and member states' national patents (which are currently being loaded) with an interface in English. For more information about ARIPO, consult the <u>detailed jurisdiction file</u>.

There is currently a second patent database including patents of ARIPO and of ARIPO's members built on the WIPO Publish platform available at this <u>link</u>, allowing a selection through a slider button between a search limited to the most frequently used fields and a broader one enlarged to a wide number of search fields, some of which however could be left empty.

Additional Information

Particularities of patent protection in Botswana

The Companies and Intellectual Property Authority (CIPA) of Botswana conducts a formalities examination of patent applications and then transmits them to ARIPO which provides a substantive examination. If the application complies with the legal requirements, a certificate of registration is issued by CIPA and the patent is published in the official journal of Botswana.

A utility model certificate granted in Botswana has a duration of protection 7 years, contrary to the 10 year term provided for ARIPO utility models.
