Ecuador has been a Contracting Party to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property since June 22, 1999. It has also been a Contracting Party to the Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) since May 7, 2001.

Ecuador is also part of the Andean Community of Intellectual Property (<u>CAN</u>), of the regional IP information platform <u>LATIPAT</u> and of the "SISTEMA DE COOPERACIÓN SOBRE ASPECTOS DE INFORMACIÓN OPERACIONAL Y DE PROPIEDAD INDUSTRIAL" (<u>PROSUR</u>).
