Jurisdiction - General Information

Guatemala has been a Contracting Party to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property since August 18, 1998. It has also been a Contracting Party to the Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) since October 14, 2006. In addition, it is a party to the Budapest Treaty on the International Recognition of the Deposit of Microorganisms for the Purposes of Patent Procedure.

Guatemala is also part of the regional IP information platform LATIPAT.

Guatemala has an Online Register and an Online Gazette.

Features and search functionalities

The Online Register has a Spanish interface.

At the time of this research, both an old and a new version of the patent register are operative. You can choose the new one by clicking on "Ingresar al Nuevo ECONSULTA / BORPI" (a free registration is required). Then, to access the patent register click on "PATENTES", to access the gazette click on "BOLETIN ELECTRONICO".

Through the Online Register you can retrieve information on **Fee Payment** and infer information on the **Legal Status**.

The Online Register can also be searched by **PCT Publication Number**.

Additional Information

Particularities of patent protection in Guatemala

An instrument of **Patent Term Extension** is available. The usual patent protection term of 20 years can be extended in case of a delay in the patent registration process (if the grant takes more than 5 years from the filing date or 3 years from the examination request) or in the delay of regulatory approval of a pharmaceutical product (more than 3 years from the application).
