Jurisdiction - General Information

Monaco has been a Contracting Party to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property since April 29, 1956. It has also been a Contracting Party to the Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) since June 22, 1979, but it can be designated only through a European Patent. In addition, it is a party to the Budapest Treaty on the International Recognition of the Deposit of Microorganisms for the Purposes of Patent Procedure and the Patent Law Treaty (PLT).

Monaco is a member of the European Patent Organization (EPO).
