Particularities of patent protection in the United Republic of Tanzania

The former Republic of Zanzibar, now part of the United Republic of Tanzania, retains its own IP rights. Patents granted in the United Kingdom (GB) may be registered in Zanzibar, provided an application is made within three years from the date of issue.
